1. Call to order.

4. Presentation by Callan Davey on UMSU/GSA Health and Dental Plan.

- In September, the GSA and UMSU changed health and dental insurance providers from Greenshield to Blue Cross as the insurance company and StudentCare Networks as the broker and administrator of the plan.
- When the change was first made, there were some transitional issues that arose.
- Prescriptions drugs have been an issue under the new plan. Some drugs weren't being filled. This
 did not raise a red flag at first, but has come up quite often since then. StudentCare created an
 action committee to look into this.
 - There was a problem with the card coding between insurance companies. It was recognized, and StudentCare has had multiple meetings with stakeholders since resolving this issue. They have been working on getting students prescriptions filled and claims reimbursed.
- StudentCare has overall received positive feedback.
- Some issues that students are still having:
 - o Some health care providers cannot direct bill to the new insurance company.
 - o The cost of prescription drugs is not reimbursed at the same percent coverage as they were under the old plan.
 - There is a formulary built into each insurance drug plan that lists the drugs that are eligible for a plan. When a plan is instituted, you pick a formulary based on the financial restraints of the plan. A formulary that includes all drugs is very expensive and not usually chosen for students as the insurers try to keep costs low. When StudentCare figured out the coding problem, they asked Greenshield to provide them with a list of the top 500 drugs claimed over the past few years. Those drugs accounted for 97% of the drug claims in the previous years. StudentCare felt comfortable using that list of drugs as their formulary.
 - Vaccinations are also not covered under the new plan. Vaccinations are important for graduate students working in specific fields or who have to travel to certain parts of the world.
 - o Information received from the Health and Dental Plan Office was not correct and service has been poor.
 - The website claims they will cover 'up to 80%' of the drug cost. The average percent coverage of Farhoud's drugs by Greenshield was 70%, the prescriptions covered by Blue Cross were covered at approximately 50%. The dispensing fee charged by pharmacies is roughly \$9.00-10.00 depending on the pharmacy you visit, with the exception of Costco who charges only \$5.00. StudentCare only pays \$5 of the dispensing fee.



- Dispensing fees are controlled exclusively by the pharmacy. Though it was covered under Greenshield, the dispensing fee is usually not a component of a health and dental plan.
- The service currently provided by Blue Cross is not the same as the service we were receiving under Greenshield.

6. UMGSA 2014/15 Elections

7. Round-Table Event: Wine and Dine if You Share What's on Your Mind

- The Round Table Event was well attended. There were six general themes that came out of the
 discussion that students felt were important: getting involved, post-graduation, fees, departments
 issues, and university services. The discussions focused on things that needed to be improved as well
 as potential solutions.
- Mike has finished summarizing the topics that were discussed, and Trish has been working on transcribing the recorded discussion.
- The Executive met with the Minister of Education and Advanced Learning, and is interested in seeing the summary of the event. The Minister has also prioritized some of the topics that were discussed at the Round Table, especially careers. This information can also be used by the Strategic Enrollment and Management Committee to improve life on campus for students.
- Mike is planning on talking to the Office of Student Life to see where they can help with these issues.

8. Holiday Hampers

Holiday hampers were distributed. There were 71 recipients.

9. Orientation Handbook Review

- Students have talked to Monika about not knowing about Orientation, or starting in January and not
 getting any Orientation information. Monika has merged graduate student information with the
 available undergraduate information. It would be better to have a handbook that is exclusively for
 graduate students.
- The Handbook is meant to be fillable by Departments, as students have expressed that they do not want something too generic. They would prefer to have something tailored to their needs.
- The handbook will be available online. The intention is to put links to resources so the handbook is easier to use as it is smaller and allows for access to required information.
 - The majority of students felt that a welcome message was important.

- Programs available in departments and contact names are listed.
 - o The purpose is to distinguish departmental and GSA Orientations, and to make sure that services are not duplicated.
- The Registration Checklist is specific to graduate students. Requirements are included for new and returning students.
- Information on IST and the accounts assigned to students is provided.
- Financial support lists various methods of getting financial support available to graduate students including grants, loans, bursaries, and TAing.
- Transportation includes information on parking passes, SafeWalk, when and where to pay for transit passes, and the Bison Grocery Run.
- Information on when students start classes and resources such as iThenticate, workshops, how to submit theses, resources for printing, photocopying and scanning, Academic Learning Centre, and how to submit your thesis.
- Additional resources lists information on FGS, GSA, campus daycare, Career Services, Health and Wellness, the Health and Dental Plan, PEERS and the Student Counselling Centre
- Getting Involved is the last section and lists potential volunteer opportunities.

10.2, Finance Committee Report

- The Finance Committee had an application that was originally received in August and has been appealed three times since then. The correct information is still not being submitted, so they recommended to the Bylaws Committee that the Financial Policy Manual be amended so that appeals are limited to two appeals except in special circumstances, at the Finance Committee's discretion.
- The Bylaws Committee has finished their review of the Financial Policy Manual.


