- 8. Review of the UMGSA's Budget/Actuals- May to December 2014 (please see Appendix B) VP Internal: Most important part is that we are well within the budget approved by Council. We receive student membership fees collected by the University from tuition payments each year (disbursed in November and March) and then money is allocated to different parts of the budget. We are on budget with one thing to highlight. There is slight overspending on Line 6605 GSA Designed items due to increased demand. \$600 was budgeted, \$850 has been spent, but our budget will allow for this.

President: BDO is our current auditor and for the past few years. In their report they say they didn't find any fraudulent activities. This is the previous executive term's audit. Also contains some recommendations for streamlining our processes for the audit.

10. Executive Committee Annual Report **Executive Committee Report**

> President: Highlights from the year include fighting the FGS proposal to increase continuing fees this brought the Executive team together at the very beginning of our term, the Anti-cuts campaign such as our rally at the January BOG meeting,

and the Universal Bus Pass (UPASS) referendum was supported by 59% of students who voted. One recommendation is to prioritize building UMGSA's organizational capacity to have a stronger presence at the university so we can be more proactive.

- 10.2. HSGSA Internal Activities Report
 Highlights included: planning the Bannatyne orientation, socials, summer activity,
 and Research Days
- 10.3. Finance Committee Report
 Committee has been very successful thanks to help from councilors, 9 special project grants, many conference grants
- 10.4. Awards Committee Report

 Two primary functions included choosing winners for the UMGSA awards, and planning a luncheon. Also took on the task of organizing GU15 research as part of partnership with the GU15. We will be discussing Austerity measures at the University of Manitoba and similar experiences across Canada. The GU15 is comprised of U15 University's graduate student associations.
- 10.5. Bylaws Committee Report
 The committee worked on the Elections policy manual. They are currently working on the Executive policy manual, trying to make it more efficient and consistent. Thanks to all members of the committee for all of their hard work.
- 10.6. Campaigns Committee Report
 VPE resigned but the written report is available in the AGM documents.
- 10.7. Events Committee Report
 Plan and organize events with different themes for networking and socializing.
 Orientation was the biggest event planned which included a social and a wine and cheese. We have had almost 1 social event per month: Halloween social, holiday social, movie night. GSA designed items for student giveaways including pens and toques. Thanks to all of the committee members.
- 10.8. Internal Development and Review Sub-Committee Report
 Committee Chairperson: Formed by 8 council members to review job
 performance of the executive team. The first evaluation phase was from May to
 October 2014. In general, UMGSA has done an excellent job, but also have some
 recommendations for opportunities to improve. They collected feedback through a
 survey to the whole graduate student body. One of main responses was that
 students wanted a decrease in emails from UMGSA, while others wanted more
 communication to know what UMGSA was doing. A range of opinions included
 support or concerns raised regarding U-PASS, funding opportunities and social
 events.

11. Review of Current Bylaws: Relationship with the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS)

- 11.1. Presentation by past UMGSA president, E. RoTimi Ojo, on the history of the relationship between UMGSA and CFS.
- 11.2. October 30, 2012: UMGSA Special General Meeting (SGM) (see Appendix E) 11.2.1. Important motions were made regarding UMGSA's relationship with CFS
- 11.3. January 30, 2013: UMGSA Annual General Meeting (AGM) (excerpt below)

- 11.3.1. Bylaws add Article IX to reflect those decisions made at the SGM and are to be reviewed annually at UMGSA's AGMs. These bylaws include:
 - University of Manitoba Graduate Students' Association is not a member of the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS), the Canadian Federation of Students- Services (CFS-S) or the Canadian Federation of Students-Manitoba (CFS-MB), herein referred to as CFS/-S/-MB and in that regard if and when necessary, it shall dispute all statements, claims, indications and suggestions of membership (full or otherwise) in the CFS/-S/-MB.
 - The UMGSA shall continue to collect and hold fees related to possible membership in CFS/-S/-MB in a contingency fund up to and including the completion of the 2017-2018 academic term or until such time that the membership status is officially conceded, in writing, between the legal counsels of the CFS/-S/-MB, the University of Manitoba and the UMGSA or determined by courts, whichever is sooner.
 - Fees that are collected in respect of possible membership in CFS/-S/-MB may be used toward the reasonable costs associated with the process of defending the position of UMGSA regarding membership in the CFS/-S/-MB until such time that the membership status is officially conceded, in writing, between the legal counsels of the CFS/-S/-MB, the University of Manitoba and the UMGSA or determined by courts, whichever is sooner
 - The general membership of the UMGSA and HSGSA shall discuss affiliations with external organizations, including but not limited to Canadian Federation of Students (National, Provincial, and/or Services), Canadian Alliance of Student Associations, at each Special/Annual General Meeting.
 - At each annual general meeting, the membership shall revisit and determine the use of all remaining fees collected from the UMGSA members and held in a contingency fund until the issue of membership in the CFS/-S/-MB is finally resolved.
- 11.3.2. BIRT once the issue of membership in the CFS/-S/-MB is finally resolved the UMGSA Membership recommends allocating the remaining fees collected from the UMGSA members and those held in a contingency fund to (please bring recommendations to be discussed at AGM).

12. Proposed Bylaw Revisions:

12.1. BIRT that in Article II, Section 2, reference to the Faculty of Health Sciences and Colleges (formerly named departments) be included to align with the University of Manitoba's restructuring process and terminology.

ARTICLE II - NAME, DESCRIPTIONS, AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

2. The UMGSA recognizes that its members within the field of Health Sciences, primarily located at Bannatyne Campus and St. Boniface Research Centre,

constitute the body known as the "Health Sciences Graduate Students' Association" (HSGSA). This includes, but is not limited to, graduate students in the Faculty of Health Science, Colleges of Dentistry, Medicine, Medical Rehabilitation, Pharmacy, and a subset of students within the department of Physics. The HSGSA operates as a part of the UMGSA, representing and fulfilling the needs of its constituent members. For a full list of departments in the HSGSA please refer to the "Council Policy Manual."

12.2. BIRT that references to Internal Development and Review Committee (IDRC) in Article III, Section 3j of the bylaws be amended to read Internal Development and Review Sub-Committee (IDRSC).

III.3.j. An executive may only be impeached by the student body which elected her; five students, who are not members of either campus' Association's Executive, must provide in writing their grievances and clear documentation of the steps taken to resolve the conflict. All information must be supplied to the Internal Review and Development Sub-Committee (IDRSC), who will hold all materials in confidence until a decision is reached. IDRSC may recommend further mediation, or submit materials to Council for consideration. Once the matter is presented to Council, all materials must be made public. Council may then decide to either consider the impeachment, or pursue further means of mediation.

12.3. BIRT that Article III, Section 3i be amended to read "Impeachment of an Executive's position should only be undertaken in circumstances when the prescribed means of mediation are exhausted. These means are outlined in Article IV titled 'Conflict Resolution Procedure' of the Executives Policy Manual".

VP Internal, Valery Agbor confirmed that the lawyer has been consulted and approved of this change. Two friendly amendments were accepted, to strike out "the newly created" and to change "all other means" to when the prescribed means are exhausted in the policy manual.

12.4. BIRT Article III, Section 3.i. (i-iv) and j of the bylaws be moved to Article, 4 of the executive policy manual.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP:

- 3. Membership of Executive:
- g. Membership of the Executive shall be terminated in the following cases:
 - i. Conviction of an indictable offence

- ii. Abuse or misappropriation of finances, resources or private information belonging to the UMGSA
- iii. Misrepresentation of the UMGSA in legal or public matters
- iv. Expulsion from her program or the University
- h. Executives may be impeached for the following:
 - i. Gross negligence
 - ii. Abuse of a fellow Executive, Council member or other individual which compromises the Executive's ability to perform their role
- i. Impeachment of an Executive's position should only be undertaken in circumstances when all other means of mediation are exhausted. These means include, but are not limited to:
 - i. Initial face to face dialogue between conflicting parties; and if it does not work
 - ii. Introduction of the conflict to UMGSA council for debate and dialogue on the way forward which may be;
 - iii. Mediation efforts from executives mandated to do so by the UMGSA council
 - iv. Formation of a commission for a fact-finding mission
 - j. An executive may only be impeached by the student body which elected her; five students, who are not members of either campus' Association's Executive, must provide in writing their grievances and clear documentation of the steps taken to resolve the conflict. All information must be supplied to the Internal Review and Development Committee, who will hold all materials in confidence until a decision is reached. IDR may recommend further mediation, or submit materials to Council for consideration. Once the matter is presented to Council, all materials must be made public. Council may then decide to either consider the impeachment, or pursue further means of mediation.
