Executive Committee

- An extra meeting was held on March 17th in order to rapidly address changes related to COVID-19. At that and subsequent meetings, COVID-19 updates and our responses to the crisis were discussed and decided-upon. 1. Statement from Senate on the Importance of Higher Education

The following statement was passed:

"The mandate of the University of Manitoba is to create, preserve, communicate, and apply knowledge. In doing so, the University contributes to the cultural, social and economic well-being of the people of Manitoba, Canada, and the world. The university serves the common good, through searching for, and disseminating, knowledge and understanding, and through fostering independent thinking and expression. We undertake basic, applied, and inquiry-based research and teaching. We are organized by core principles of autonomy, academic freedom and collegial governance.

The University of Manitoba believes that education has a transformative power for students, their families and communities. We are committed to inspiring minds through innovative and quality teaching. We drive discovery and insight through excellence in research, scholarly work and other creative activities. We create pathways to Indigenous achievement. We promote equity, inclusion, and excellence. We forge connections to foster high impact community engagement that build on the advantages of a diverse and inclusive workplace.

The University of Manitoba is the province's only research-intensive university, and all assessments of our contributions to the dynamic social and economic life of our province must recognize our broad mandate and inclusive mission, which has short-term, mid-term, and long-term effects and implications. Our 30,000-plus full and part-time undergraduate and graduate students and our 5,000-plus faculty members undertaking teaching and research are part of a complex institution, one that does much more than simply train students for today's labour market. Higher education generates social, as well as individual, benefits. We provide a public good that helps to promote wisdom and to build a just, inclusive and prosperous province for all people"

The Senate was additionally informed that the students are writing a letter. Given COVID-19, the students letter is on hold until next term when we believe it will garner more media attention.

2. Proposal to Establish a Professorship in Diabetes Research

The Rady Faculty of Health Sciences has proposed a Professorship in Diabetes Research.

The purpose of the Professorship is to "support a Clinician-Scientist for research in endocrinology" and to "provide leadership, scholarship, and mentorship in the area of diabetes research".

The Chair will be funded through the former Diabetes Foundation of Manitoba / John A. Moorhouse Fellowship, which will transition to the Professorship in Diabetes Research in the Endocrine Section of the Department of Internal Medicine

Motion was Carried

3. Reports of the Faculty of Graduate Studies on Course and Curriculum Changes a. Faculty of Education

The Faculty of Education M.Ed. program proposed the deletion of two (2) courses, EDUA 7600 and EDUA 7650, the introduction of two (2) courses, EDUA 7602 and EDUA 7652, and the modification of three (3) courses, EDUA 7610, EDUA 7630, and EDUB 7500. The minor curricular changes primarily entail updating the words "special education" to "inclusive education" or "inclusion" as preferred by the inclusive education area group in Educational Administration, Foundations & Psychology. Other changes involve updates to pre-requisites

Motion was Carried

b. Department of Occupational Therapy

The College of Rehabilitation Sciences (M.OT.) proposed the deletion of five (5) courses, OT 6120,OT 6140, OT 6350, OT 7540, and OT 7740, the introduction of five (5) courses, OT 6122, OT 6142, OT6352, OT 7542, and OT 7742, and the modification of one (1) course, OT 6110. The MOT curriculum committee and the Occupational Therapy faculty request these curricular changes to ensure that course names and descriptions accurately reflect the content delivered in the MOT program

c. Department of Psychology

The Dept. of Psychology proposed the introduction of one (1) course, PSYC 7082, to meet a number of needs at the University of Manitoba, none of which were currently being met by courses offered in the department, nor similar areas, such as Social Work or Education. In particular, this course is needed to fulfill the Canadian Psychological Association accreditation requirement for a course in social psychology for the accredited Clinical Psychology doctoral program. Moreover, it was needed to ensure these students had formal training in working with more complex systems. This course is also intended to provide school psychology students with formal training in therapy. The department has consulted with its colleagues in outside departments, as well as the libraries, all of whom support the proposal

4. Proposal for a Bachelor of Science (Major) in Data Science + Co-op

The University of Manitoba approved a new Data Science undergraduate program. Though this is not overly relevant to graduate students, we thought it was an exciting introduction worth noting.

5. Approval of Authority in an Emergency Situation

The following motion was passed at the March 16th, 2020 Senate meeting:

In the event of an emergency, as declared by the President, Senate authorizes the Senate Executive Committee to act for Senate in determining academic matters which require urgent resolution. Should the nature of the emergency warrant it, the authority to make decisions may be delegated by Senate Executive to the Provost and Vice-President (Academic) These matters include, but are not limited to:

- a) Revisions to the academic schedule and the delay of the exam period and changes to other dates and deadlines;
- b) The temporary modification or suspension of academic policies, such as the Final Examinations and Final Grades Policy, the Responsibility of Academic Staff to Students Policy, in response to the emergency;
- c) Changes to assessment requirements;
- d) Completion of course requirements;
- e) Changes of requirements of continuing awards;
- f) Approving academic accommodations for students affected by the emergency.

Decisions made under this delegated authority should be confined to dealing with specific issues related to the emergency for the period of the emergency and for the period immediately after the emergency. Care must be taken to avoid making decisions that may have ongoing implications for the delivery of academic programs. Normal approval channels shall be restored by the President as soon as it is permissible and safe to do so. The Senate Executive Committee shall report any actions taken to Senate both by email and at the subsequent meeting of Senate following an emergency situation.

UMGSA Executive Reports March 1st - 31st, 2020

Executive Summary of Work:

- UMGSA Governance and Communications Coordinator Interviews: The Selection Committee interviewed six applicants. After deliberation, the Committee recommended Julia Minarik as the new permanent UMGSA Governance and Communications Coordinator. An email vote was sent to Council so that Julia could begin right away, taking over after the end of the contracted period for the temporary Coordinator. The email vote confirming Julia as the Coordinator was ratified at the March Council meeting. Julia has excelled in her role from the time of her start, and is very proactive in her work. We thank Colin Ijebor for his service during what was originally a maternity leave for our former Coordinator, Jayne Hammond. We also wish Jayne well with her new job.
- **UofM Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Consultation for Graduate Students:** The University organized a series of consultation sessions on the topic of EDI with various groups around campus. This session was held specifically to receive input from graduate students. Though unfortunately the turnout at the session was low, I feel that we contributed meaningful input to inform the University's ongoing efforts in support of equity, diversity, and inclusion.
- **UofM Academic Sub-Committee on COVID-19:** The COVID-19 pandemic is something that affects us all in very deep ways, and we wish everyone health and well-being during this difficult time. This sub-committee consisted mostly of administrators, but also included a rep from each of the UMGSA and UMSU as well. The committee discussed emerging and urgent problems and questions to find solutions and paths forward during the unprecedented social distancing and mass shut-downs. Recommendations were then sent to the Senate Executive Committee for approval using the emergency powers granted to it by Senate during this emergency. Though discussions there are confidential, most things have now been approved and communicated publicly.

Vice-President Academic - Tanjit Nagra

Executive Summary of Work:

- U-Pass: On March 6 we received a tip that the U-Pass Program was being cut in the proposed city budget. In response to this, I worked with student leaders from UMSU, UWSA and RRCSA in efforts to save the U-Pass program. We met with various City Councillors and Winnipeg Transit, we also spoke to many community leaders over the phone, created an online campaign and spoke at committee meetings at City Hall. It resulted in the City including the U-Pass in their budget at a higher rate and admitting to a \$4.3 million budget discrepancy. The U-Pass Program continuation will still be put to a vote through referendum.
- COVID-19: I have been responding to student questions and raising questions and concerns to the Vice Provost Students and Dean of FGS (where relevant). I have also been in consistent communication with the UMSU VPA and Co-Chair of Student Senate Caucus. We have been meeting almost weekly at Senate Executive Committee making timely decisions related to academic programs and adapting them due to the social distancing measures. The updates to academic policies are shared timely with students via email and on the UM website. If anyone has any concerns or questions, feel free to email me at vpa@umgsa.org.
- Transition of new VPA: I have begun transitioning in my successor and working on a report.
- Office Hours: My office hours were often scheduled when I had to be at City Hall this month and at an Executive Committee Meeting, we agreed on forgiving any missed office hours as we are not allowed on campus now.

Appendix VI:

Proposed Wording of Multi-Campus Committee Policy

Article VIII: Standing Committees

8. Multi-Campus Committee

a. Membership

- i. The President of the UMGSA (counted as one of the representatives from their home campus).
- ii. Two representatives from each of the following campuses: Fort Garry, Bannatyne, Université de St. Boniface, St. Boniface Research Centre and William Norrie Centre.
- iii. Two or more representatives that are stationed at satellite research locations or out of province.

b. Mandate

- i. Pursue initiatives that support equitable communications to all UMGSA members regardless of location.
- ii. Make recommendations to the UMGSA Executive on providing advocacy, services and support to students located at all campuses and satellite locations.
- iii. To promote and support inter-campus events and initiatives.
- iv. Committee members are required to obtain satisfactory "Consent Culture Training" prior to November 1st as described in Article IV, point 5.

c. Meetings

- i. The Multi-Campus Committee will normally meet once per month.
- ii. The first meeting in a new executive term will take place in May and will be chaired by the UMGSA President. Subsequent meetings will be chaired in rotation by committee members.
- iii. Meetings will be held on the campus of the Chairperson for that meeting when that campus is located within the city of Winnipeg.
- iv. The Committee will facilitate remote participation for every meeting.
- v. Each meeting will include an open forum for members to report on successes, challenges, and areas of opportunity at their respective locations.
- vi. The UMGSA President shall, by the end of each meeting, list on that meeting's attendance sheet those members of the committee that had sent regrets as well as those that were absent without sending regrets.

d. Reporting and Authority

i. The UMGSA President shall report to Council at each scheduled monthly meeting to provide an update on Multi-Campus Committee activities.
