I am interested in talking to immigrant* and international* graduate students (studying in Master or Ph.D. programs) who have already completed one year of their program. This study also seeks out students who identify as racialized* persons, and their identity will include gender diversity (male/female/non-binary/trans) and/or sexual orientation (e.g., 2LGBTQ+). I intend to learn about their academic experiences that might be influenced due to having multiple identities (e.g., being black and lesbian-woman). Study participants will be asked to participate in individual interviews (audio/video recorded) to answer a few demographic questions and discuss a set of predetermined questions relating to their perceptions and experience.

With the compliance of protecting participants' confidentiality and privacy, your participation in the study is entirely voluntary, and you can withdraw at any point without any penalty. Your time commitment to this study is approximately 60 minutes for the interview session that will be conducted using UM Zoom platform at your convenient time. All the information obtained in the interview will be stored on a UM-approved platform. You will receive a complimentary e-gift card in appreciation of your time and participation in this study. There are no consequences for choosing not to participate.

***Racialized Person**

As per Statistics Canada, racialized persons is a term used to describe the identities of those who may have experienced the social effects of marginalization based on notions of race, ethnicity, or “origin.”

***Immigrant Student**

Individuals who are, or who have ever been, *landed immigrants* or *permanent residents* are ‘immigrants’ and get enrolled in educational institutions are immigrant students. Both of these categories of students are identified as racialized due to having phenotype and cultural characteristics such as skin tone, accent or manner of speech, name, clothing, diet, beliefs and practices, places of origin and the like.

***International Student**

International students are defined as non-Canadian students who do not have “permanent resident” status and have had to obtain the Canadian government’s authorization (study permit/student visa) to enter Canada to pursue an education. This study includes racialized international students attributed to this category because of their race marked by skin colour, language, culture, and way of being.
